Scouts BSA Summer Camp reached a historic milestone this summer, **achieving its highest attendance in 60 years.**



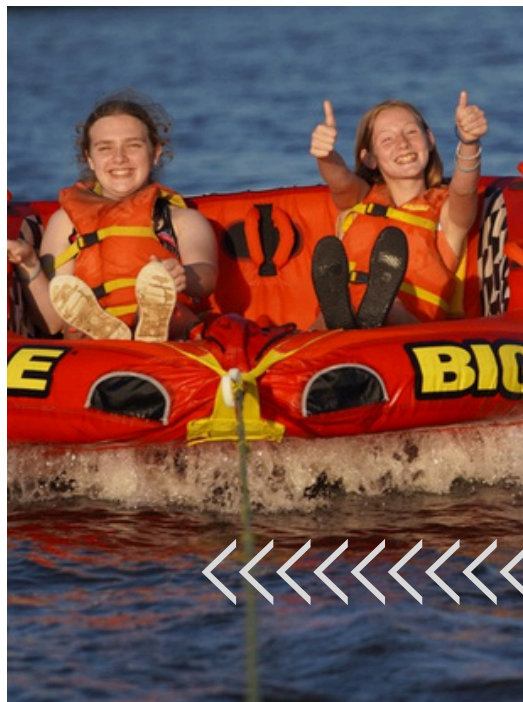

## SCOUTS GATHER FOR INVENTION JAMBOREE

Nearly 200 Scouts from across Missouri’s five councils gathered at the Lake of the Ozarks Scout Reservation for the **2025 Invention Jamboree**, held October 3–5 at the Sinquefield Invention Campus. The two-day event showcased hands-on experiences in innovation, STEM, and entrepreneurship, blending traditional Scouting with advanced technology and creative problem-solving. Governor Mike Kehoe made a special appearance, marking his fourth visit to the Jamboree since the program’s launch in 2019 and emphasizing sustained statewide support for the initiative.

The Jamboree offered Scouts activities focused on turning ideas into real-world inventions. Scouts rotated through invention stations that allowed them to work with tools such as laser engravers, 3-D printers, metalworking, and electronics. These activities were designed to help participants fulfill requirements for the Inventing Merit Badge while strengthening skills in design thinking, prototyping, teamwork, and entrepreneurial mindset.

More than 100 Scouts earned the Inventing Merit Badge during the event, a key highlight that underscored the program’s emphasis on creativity, collaboration, and applied learning. Scouts also had opportunities to learn directly from seasoned inventors,

engineers, and business leaders who shared insights into product development, innovation processes, and career pathways in STEM fields.

The **Sinquefield Invention Campus**, the only facility of its kind in Scouting, features four laboratory spaces, including a makerspace, metalworking and woodworking shops, and a skills and trades building. The campus provides year-round merit badge training in areas such as game design, sustainability, radio, photography, and sculpturing, giving Scouts access to tools and experiences they might not encounter elsewhere.

Missouri S&T and the University of Missouri partnered with the Jamboree to provide scientific expertise and mentorship throughout the weekend.

## Lake Ozark's John Hayes Earns All 140 Scouting Merit Badges

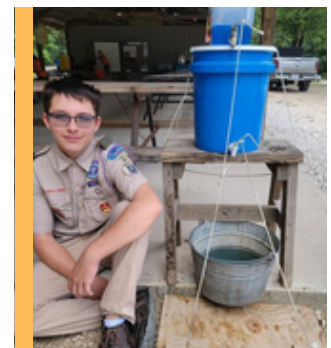
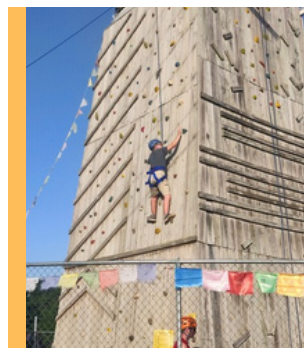
John Hayes, a member of Troop 21 at Lake Ozark, completed his 140<sup>th</sup> merit badge just before his 18<sup>th</sup> birthday, topping off a six-year journey that required extensive time, dedication, travel and learning a wide range of skills outside of school. This effort earned John the distinguished recognition of being the 621<sup>st</sup> Scout in the national history of our organization to ever achieve this rare feat since the Scouting program began in 1910.

John started earning merit badges in grade school, and by middle school he already knew many of the topics being taught in his classes. John has credited the **Sinquefield Invention Campus** at Lake of the Ozarks Scout Reservation as the place where he learned more than 80 of his merit badges. This unique campus provided John with the necessary equipment and instruction needed to earn the numerous STEM-related badges available through Scouting.

John indicates that Camp Hohn became a home away from home for over six years, having spent tremendous amounts of time at camp to earn merit badges. He utilized the **Sinquefield Invention Campus** to complete his Eagle Scout community service project in early 2025.

John built and installed new roadway signs welcoming travelers to the City of Lake Ozark. This involved layout design, 3-D modeling, and digital engraving of the signs that were placed at the city limits. John was recognized by the City of Lake Ozark Board of Aldermen.

At age 15, John earned the Aviation merit badge and has now earned his FAA student pilot license. He plans to become a commercial airline pilot after college. John credits this merit badge and his grandfather, a former F-15 fighter pilot that served as his merit badge counselor, for inspiring him.

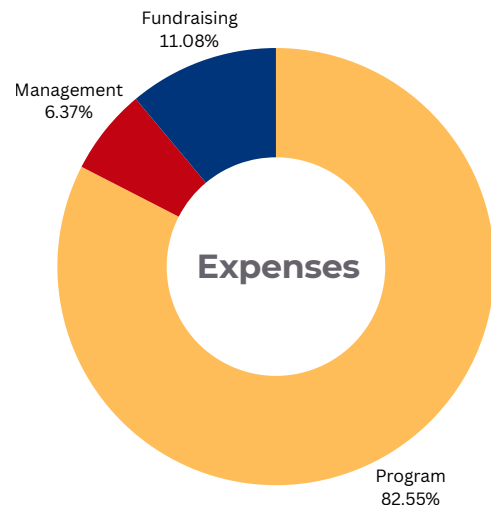
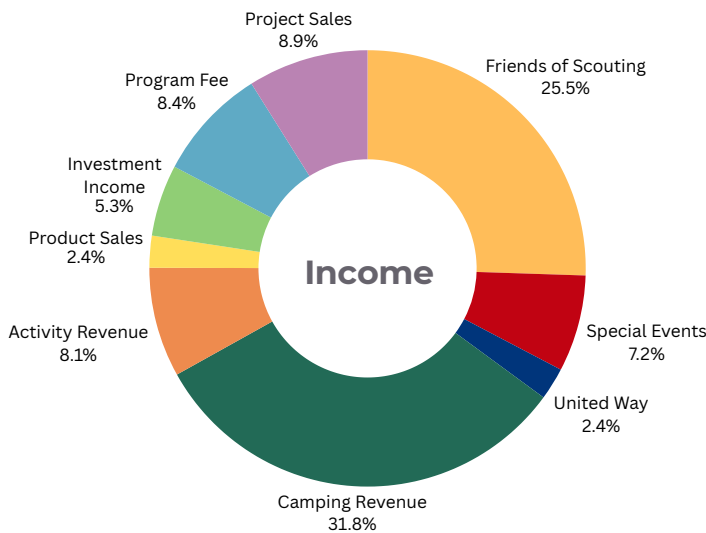
